Chapter 3: Clearing Web Browser Cache

This chapter describes procedures for clearing the cache (browsing history) from a web browser installed on a PC running the Windows 7 operating system. However, the procedures should be similar for other operating systems.

How to clear Microsoft Internet Explorer cache

This procedure was written using Microsoft Internet Explorer 11 (11.0.9600.18163) but in general is applicable to other release versions

- 1) Close all open Internet Explorer windows
- 2) Open Internet Explorer and select "Internet Options" from the Tools menu


3) Click the "Delete..." button under Browsing history

This procedure was written using Mozilla FireFox 45.0.1 but in general is applicable to other release versions

- 1) Close all open FireFox windows
- 2) Open FireFox, click the "Open menu" button, and click "History"

This procedure was written using Google Chrome Version 49.0.2623.87 but in general is applicable to other release versions

- 1) Close all open Chrome windows
- 2) Open Chrome, click on the Customize and control Google Chrome menu next to the URL field, select "More tools", and then select "Clear browsing data"

How to clear Java cache

This procedure was written using Java Version 8 Update 73 but in general is applicable to other release versions

- 1) Close all open browsers and running Java applications (i.e. Viavi GUIs, etc.)
- 2) Open the "Control Panel" from the Windows Start menu. It will be in Category or Icon view depending on how it was last used.





Figure 9: Windows Control Panel home page (Category view)

Chapter 6: Glossary

Term	Definition
APAC	Asia-Pacific
Cache	Repository for stored data that is used to expedite the process of retrieving data
Chrome	Open-source web browser software application developed by Google
EMEA	Europe, Middle East, and Africa
FireFox	Open-source web browser software application developed by Mozilla
Folder	Storage location on a computer drive for grouping together files and folders as a means of organizing the file system. A term used by Windows and other operating systems, and synonymous with "directory".
Internet Explorer	Web browser software application developed by Microsoft.
Java	General purpose programming language designed to develop programs to run on virtually any computer, and for use in the distributed environment of the Internet
Java Cache	Cache, typically on local hard drive, used for storage of Java applets so they are not downloaded each time they are referenced
LA	Latin America
NA	North America
PC	Personal Computer (i.e. desktop workstation or laptop)
TAC	Technical Assistance Center
Web Browser	Software application used for accessing, navigating, searching, and displaying content from the World Wide Web (Internet).
Browser Cache	Cache, typically on local hard drive, used for temporary storage of files downloaded from web sites (i.e. HTML pages, images, etc.) so they can be quickly loaded when the page is re-visited
Windows	Computer operating system with a graphical user interface, developed by Microsoft
